Friday, August 18 - Portland, Oregon

Arrive independently to Portland, Oregon and make your way downtown to our hotel. This evening, gather for a welcome reception at our hotel, and a festive dinner at a nearby restaurant.

Sunday, August 20 - The Wonderful Willamette

This morning we explore the State Capitol for a tower tour and to learn more about the history of Oregon and the state's legislative process. Then discover the world of wine that serves as a backbone to the Willamette Valley. Mary Roach, Guest Speaker

Mary Roach is the author of the New York Times bestsellers *STIFF: The Curious Lives of Human Cadavers; GRUNT: The Curious Science of Humans at War; GULP: Adventures on the Alimentary Canal, PACKING FOR MARS: The Curious Science of Life in the Void;* and *BONK: The Curious Coupling of Science and Sex.* Mary has written for *National Geographic, Wired, Discover, New Scientist, the Journal of Clinical Anatomy,* and *Outside,* among others. She serves as a member of the Mars Institute's Advisory Board and the Usage Panel of American Heritage Dictionary. Her 2009 TED talk made the organization's 2011 Twenty Most-Watched To Date list. She was the guest editor of the 2011 *Best American Science and Nature Writing,* a finalist for the 2014 Royal Society Winton Prize, and a winner of the American Engineering Societies' Engineering Journalism Award, in a category for which, let's be honest, she was the sole entrant.

Steven Beckwith, Guest Speaker



Steven Beckwith is a Professor of Astronomy at the University of California, Berkeley. His 40-year research career spans many interests including the formation and early evolution of extra-solar planetary systems, the evolution of young stars, and the birth of galaxies in the early universe. In 2004, he led the team that created the Hubble Ultra Deep Field, the deepest visual image of the universe, resulting in the discovery of the most distant galaxies ever seen. He has published approximately 200 articles and won several international awards for his work. Professor Beckwith is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and a Fellow of the California Academy of Sciences. He has served as Director of the Max-Planck-Institut für Astronomie (Heidelberg, Germany), the Director of the Space Telescope Science Institute (Baltimore, Maryland), and most recently as the Vice President for Research and Graduate Studies for the ten-campus University of California system (Oakland, California). He has been on the faculties of Cornell University and Johns Hopkins University prior to coming to Berkeley in 2008.
